The 2024 Idaho Indian Education Conference invites ALL educators across the K-20 system, scholars within all disciplines, and community members to submit proposals for presentations that explore the historical significance and contemporary impact of the Indian Citizenship Act (ICA) of 1924. This landmark legislation granted U.S. citizenship to Indians by birthright.

Presentation Topics: We encourage submissions that delve into the challenges, progress, and educational implications stemming from the ICA that have unfolded over the past century. Possible presentation topics include:

1. Historical Perspectives: Reflecting on the context and significance of the Indian Citizenship Act of 1924.

- 2. Voting Rights and Representation: Though Citizenship was in 1924, the right to vote did not begin for American Indians until 1948.
- 3. Tribal Sovereignty and Treaty rights: Explore how the enactment of citizenship influenced many facets of how tribes maintained their way of life, such as treaty rights and obligations, self-governance, healthcare, education, and more.
- 4. Educational Equity: Examining the progress of academic outcomes and educational opportunities for American Indian students since 1924.
- Culturally Responsive Practices: Highlighting contributions and practices in all disciplines from tribal communities.
 Policy and Advocacy: Discussing policies, initiatives, and advocacy efforts related to Indian Education across the K-20 public school

• What are the main concepts I want attendees to take away from my presentation?

• How does my topic relate to the reflection of the ICA?
