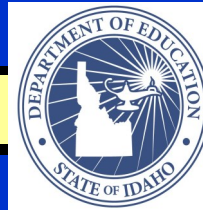

August 15, 2016 - March 15, 2017	Optional <u>Interim</u> Assessment	Optional Comprehensive and Block Assessments Grade 3-8 and HS.
August 15 - September 23, 2016	Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), Fall	Fall Reporting/Discrepancy Window Closes October 24, 2016 (Optional Winter Testing: January-February 2017).
October 19, 2016 November 2, 2016 (Alternate Make-up Date)	PSAT	State-wide Optional Sophomore Administration (state-funded).
January 1 – March 31, 2017	ISAT Alternate Science (IPASS Portfolio Submission)	Required for Grades 5, 7, and 10. IPASS Closing March 31, 2017 at midnight (12:00 am MST).
January 30 – March 10, 2017	NAEP	NAEP will administer mathematics, reading, and writing assessments to students in grades 4 and 8.
February 06 – May 26, 2017 (extended)	End-of-Course Science (Biology and Chemistry)	The EOC is a component of the Comprehensive Assessment Program. The High School End of Course assessments in Biology or Chemistry are administered in the spring to students in grades 10–12.
January 30 – March 10, 2017	WIDA – ACCESS 2.0 Idaho’s English Language Proficiency Assessment	ACCESS 2.0 for ELs (Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Language Learners) is the English language proficiency assessment given to Kindergarten through 12th graders who have been identified as English Learners (ELs).
March 20 – May 26 2017 (extended)	ISAT- ELA & Math	Required for Grades 3-8 and 10 (Grades 9 & 11 - optional).
March 20 – May 26, 2017 (extended)	ISAT–Science	Required for Grades 5 and 7.

March 20 – May 26, 2017 (extended)	ISAT Alternate Assessment ELA & Math by NCSC	Required for Grades 3-8 and 11 for eligible students.
April 10 – May 19, 2017	Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), Spring	Spring Reporting/Discrepancy Window Closes June 16, 2017. (new date)
April 10 – May 19, 2017	Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), Alternate	K-2 Spring Administration Only.
April 11, 2017 April 25, 2017	SAT— School Day Administration SAT (Make-up)	11th Grade, state funded college entrance exam. Make-up date intended for students registered for, but not in attendance on school day administration; requires transfer of registration on College Board account. SAT (ACCUPLACER Diagnostic no longer meets the CEE requirement. ACCUPLACER Placement will be available for a select group of students.)
District/School Determination	Civics	Students must demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the fundamentals of United States history and the principles and form of United States government. Districts provide their own assessment. Law requires students to take the 100 questions from the United States Citizenship and Immigrations Services Naturalization Test. A school district or public charter school shall document on the pupil's transcript that the pupil has passed with a passing threshold.
No Testing School Year 2016-2017	PIRLS	International comparative study of the reading literacy of young students. PIRLS studies the reading achievement and reading behaviors and attitudes of 4th grade students in the U.S. and participating countries.
No Testing School Year 2016-2017	PISA	International assessment that measures 15-year-old students' reading, mathematics and science literacy every three years.

Assessment Monitoring	Provide districts an opportunity to self-evaluate and improve assessment programs – required under federal and state law (ESSA)
EOC	End of Course Assessment (Biology or Chemistry) all students are required to participate once during high school years
ISAT Alternate Assessment ELA and Math by NCSC	Idaho National Center and State Collaborative Alternate Assessment Consortium - for eligible students
IRI	Idaho Reading Indicator - The Idaho SDE recommends the Winter Benchmark Assessment for those students considered “at risk” in the fall
IRI Alternate	Idaho Reading Indicator - Alternate Assessment (Core Phonics or SAM for students that meet the criteria for participation on the alternate assessment)
ISAT- Alternate Science	Idaho Standards Achievement Tests Alternate Assessment (ePortfolio version for students that meet the criteria for participation on the alternate assessment)

PIRLS	Progress in International Reading Literacy Study <i>No testing during School Year 2016-2017</i>
