Hot Recruiting Tip from the Field – Finding Out-of-School Youth

When looking for Out-of-School Youth (OSY), it is hard to find youth who are here to work, but these are potential migrant OSY. One way to find these youth is to look on the Department of Labor, Employment & Training Administration [Public Job Registry website](#) for H2A workers, many of whom are less than 22 years old and qualify. Click the link here or go to the SDE migrant website and look in links, under ID&R. Once you are at the website, you can put in your zip code(s) and how far out from there you would like to search. It will pull up the farmers' applications for workers, how many they will have, when they will arrive, their work hours, where they will be housed, and a lot of other information. If you think about it, these should be some of the easiest OSY to find. Since they are here on a special VISA, they can only stay from 2-10 months. Now is a good time to look, as farmers have some workers coming in now and throughout the summer. Potential services to these youth may include English lessons on MP3s, hygiene kits, or first aid kits.

Challenge: Put in your zip code(s) and see how many contracts are in your district. You might be surprised!
