I have heard people say, "I learned this great new thing at the National Migrant Conference." I would like to collect this wisdom to share with all of you, whether it is about recruiting or not. If you went to the conference, please bring a teaser of a great session you attended to the regional training. It could be something like the below or just a sentence or two.

Subject: I attended 2 sessions that included information about creating layered Google Maps (from Indiana and Florida).

What made it good: The maps included information from databases online about farms/employers, but it also would include my notes from all my previous visits to places. It would create a single space that included all my leads and could be shared with others. I could plan recruiting trips using it and I would be organized and systematic.

How could I implement it: Use the handouts and start playing with the maps. Already reaching out for an overlay of district boundaries to share with districts. Pairing liaisons from neighboring districts would benefit with this layer.
