This rule is a do-over of AARF Tracking # A170-2017-6. The prior AARF was denied because the temp rule was not justified. This request form is the same request, minus the request for the Temporary Rule. Compass was previously accepted as a College Entrance Examination, and this rule clearly establishes student participation in the Compass for meeting the College Entrance Examination graduation requirement. The rule clarifies participation for seniors who did not take a College Entrance Exam in their junior year, students with disabilities on an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), and students who were home schooled during their junior year. This rule also provides additional options for meeting the college entrance exam requirement.

This rule amends IDAPA 08.02.03.105 to allow students who took the Compass exam before the final November 2016 test administration (who may be graduating in 2017 or after) to use the Compass to meet the College Entrance Examination graduation requirement. This rule will also add language to update the college entrance examination graduation requirements for students on an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and students who are home schooled during their junior year. Additionally, rule language is added to give students another testing option for those who are unable to participate in the ACT or in the statewide test day administration of the SAT.
