[Sixty-seventh Legislature Second Regular Session - 2024; House Concurrent Resolution No. 25](#)

House Concurrent Resolution No. 25, introduced during the 2024 session of the Idaho Legislature, encourages the Idaho Department of Education to adopt age-appropriate Holocaust education in school districts and public charter schools. It highlights the importance of teaching the Holocaust to promote respect, combat antisemitism and all forms of prejudice, and uphold democratic values and civil responsibility. It states that learning the lessons of the Holocaust can help prevent future atrocities and that teaching about the Holocaust can empower students to become critical thinkers, active citizens, and defenders of human rights by equipping them with the knowledge and skills to recognize and challenge patterns of misinformation, intolerance, and discrimination. The resolution calls for the development of resources and professional learning activities for educators and urges collaboration with experts to ensure accuracy and effectiveness in teaching this sensitive topic.
