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SHOULD I STAY HOME CHECKLIST

Your child should stay home ONLY when he/she has one of the following:

- Signs or symptoms of Covid/Influenza
- Fever (100 degrees or higher) A child should be *fever-free without medication for 24 hrs* before returning to school
- Bad cold especially if it keeps your child awake at night Colored (yellow/greenish) drainage from nose or eyes Persistent cough
- Strep Throat must have been taking antibiotics at least 24 hours before returning to school
- Vomiting within the last 24 hours A child should be able to keep solid foods down
- Diarrhea within the last 24 hours A child should have solid bowel movement before returning
- Rash/Skin infections especially with fever or itching
- Eye infections teary, redness, swelling, yellow drainage
- Head Lice must start treatment before returning to school
