

58 total questions 2 sections – calculator and no calculator



44 total questions
1 section – with calculator

80 total minutes (1.38 min/question)



70 total minutes (1.59 min/question)

Discrete and set based questions Multiple-choice (≈78%) Student-produced response (SPR) (≈22%)



Discrete questions Four-option multiple-choice (≈75%) Student-produced response (SPR) (≈25%)



### Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing

#### Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing vs Item Level Adaptive Testing

	Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing (MST)	Item Adaptive
<b>Test Delivery</b>	Sets of questions (called modules)	One item at a time
Adaptive	Based on how students perform in the previous module	Based on a student responds to each question
Navigation	Students can review items within a module	Students are not able to go back to a question
Test Length	Supports shorter test lengths	Supports shorter test lengths
Examples	GRE, digital SAT	ACCUPLACER, SBAC, NWEA - MAP, NCLEX



#### Benefits of Multi-Stage Adaptive Testing

- √ Shorter tests
- ✓ Questions are tailored according to students' achievement
- ✓ Allows students to navigate back to questions within a module
- ✓ More secure testing
- Allows disruptions in internet connectivity
- ✓ More precise measurement





# The digital SAT will have two modules in each section

# Module 1 Students are given a broad mix of easy, medium, and hard questions. Module 2 Students are given a targeted mix of questions of varying difficulty based on their performance in Module 1. Student's Score



# **Technology Requirements**

#### Device Requirements

Device should be able to hold a charge for 3 hours



Device must be able to connect to Wi-Fi



#### **Device Specifications**

- Windows laptops/tablets must be running Windows 10 or later and have at least 250 MB of free space available.
- Mac laptops must be running macOS 11.4 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available.
- iPads must be running iPadOS 14 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available.
- School-managed Chromebooks must be running Chrome OS 100 or later and have at least 150 MB of free space available. You cannot run Bluebook on a personal Chromebook.

#### Network Requirements

All students and testing staff (coordinators, proctors, and monitors) must connect to your Wi-Fi on test day. This includes:

Students and testing staff who are unaffiliated with your institution.

Students and testing staff who are using personal devices.

You may need to set up guest access. Be sure to share the network password with staff so they can share it with students.


#### Test Day Toolkit - Pre-Test Day Steps

Digital test administrations depend on Test Day Toolkit, a web application.


All test coordinators, proctors, and monitors need to access it on test day.

- They'll need a College Board professional account to access it.
- They can use their own laptop, tablet, mobile device, or one provided by the school.

Before test day, test coordinators complete the following activities in Test Day Toolkit to prepare for the test administration. Coordinators need to complete test day readiness steps for each event (i.e. PSAT 8/9, PSAT/NMSQT, retests):

#### BEFORE TEST DAY


Give students their sign-in tickets, and have them complete a test preview in Bluebook. If you conduct a preadmin session, collect the sign-in tickets after and reuse them on test day.

#### TEST DAY (BEFORE THE TEST)

Give students their sign-in tickets, and tell them to sign in to Bluebook and complete check-in (when they reach the Start Code page, check-in is complete).




Collect all sign-in tickets before you dismiss students. Destroy sign-in tickets with a shredder.







# **Universal Tools Now Available to All Students**

- Zoom & Passage/Item Expansion
- Color Contrast
- Calculator & Math Reference Sheet
- Strikethrough, Annotation, Mark for Review, and Question Navigator
- Personal Countdown Clock

Other tools that still require an approved accommodation – e.g., extended time, extra and/or extended breaks or breaks as needed; Text-to-Speech and Speech-to-Text; Assistive Technology; etc. – are more easily applied in new digital. Non-technology embedded accommodations remain unchanged.
