

0	Designate staff personnel to be the Foster Care Liaison to work collaboratively with Idaho Health & Welfare representatives in making the best interest determination for a foster care student.										
0	Provide educational stability for students in foster care by keeping these students in their schools of origin, unless it is collaboratively determined to be in their best interest to change schools.										
	Each foster care student is individually assessed on a case by case basis through a structured decision making process that includes the Local Education Agency (LEA) Foster Care Liaison, Idaho Health & Welfare Social Worker, pertinent school personnel, foster parent/guardian, and the student.										
0	Collaborate with Idaho Health & Welfare to ensure that transportation for students in foster care is provided, arranged, and funded.										
0	Ensure that a student in foster care is immediately enrolled in his or her new school even if the student does not have the required documentation. The enrolling school must contact the student's prior school for relevant records.										
0	Manage transportation and certify that student in foster care remains in his or her school of origin while disputes are being resolved.




