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## FEDERAL REPORTING FOR DISCIPLINE AND BEHAVIOR

The purpose of this document is to provide an overview of Idaho's federal reporting requirements related to data on disciplinary action and behavior. All data collections listed below are required federal reporting. The table below provides the name of the required data collection, a basic description of the collection, basic data requirements, the entity responsible for submitting data to the federal level, and the federal reporting authority reference(s).

Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC) (Reported Biannually –on Odd Years)	The purpose of U.S. Department of Education (Department) Civil Rights Data Collection (CRDC) is to obtain data on key education and civil rights issues in our nation's public schools, including student enrollment and educational programs and services. For purposes of this document only the reporting requirements related to discipline or behavior are included. A full list of reporting requirements, reporting modules, and additional resources are available at the Civil Rights Data Collection Resource Center.	Information are submitted at the LEA and school building level.
