



## OSEP Fast Facts: Release of the 2018-19/2019 IDEA Section 618 Data

Section 618 of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires that each state submit data about the infants and toddlers, birth through age 2, who receive early intervention services under Part C of IDEA and children with disabilities, ages 3 through 21, who receive special education and related services under Part B of IDEA.

### New Data Files!



### Number of Infants and Toddlers with Disabilities, Ages 0 Through 2, Served Under IDEA, Part C, in the US and Outlying Areas: 2010-19

The percentage of population of infants and toddlers receiving early intervention services under IDEA, Part C, birth through 2 years, increased from 2.95% in 2014-15 to 3.7% in 2019-20.




● Age Birth to 1 ● Age 1 to 2 ● Age 2 to 3









A disciplinary removal is defined as any instance in which a child with a disability is removed from his/her educational placement for disciplinary purposes, including in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension, expulsion, removal by school personnel to an interim alternative educational setting for drug or weapon offenses or serious bodily injury, and removal by hearing officer for likely injury to the child or others.


SY 2019-20 was the transition year for reporting 5-year-olds in Kindergarten in FS002 - Children with Disabilities (IDEA) School Age. States/entities had the option to report children that are 5 years old in the reporting categories "Age 5 (School Age)" and "Age 5 (Early Childhood)". The permanent change takes place in SY 2020-21.


