

Advanced Opportunities: Homeschool Student Access and Participation

The following are guidelines for homeschool student(s) wishing to access Advanced Opportunities funding and tuition discounts.

FUNDING

Idaho homeschool students in grades 7-12, wishing to access Advanced Opportunities funds may do so by attending one of the following.

Idaho Public School

1. Attending an Idaho public school.

Benefit: Student is eligible for \$4,625 in funds. Funds can be used for dual credit courses, outof-district community college fees, workforce training courses, exams (inclusive of college placement exams) and certifications.

Idaho Accredited Private School

2. Attending a Cognia accredited Idaho private school.

Benefit: Student is eligible for \$2,500 in funds. Funds can be used for dual credit courses, exams and certifications.

Attendance policies will vary by school. It is recommended students and families inquire with the individual school to learn about the attendance policy for accessing Advanced Opportunities funds. Policies can range from one course to full-time requirements. Once homeschool students meet attendance policies, the student will follow school policies and procedures for the program.

DUAL CREDIT

Homeschool students can be eligible for reduced tuition amounts of \$75 per credit at many Idaho colleges (e.g. community colleges) for dual credit college courses regardless of Idaho public school or Idaho accredited private school attendance. Inquiries should be made with each college. Not all colleges or courses are eligible. Cost for dual credit courses can vary based on location, course, or term. Consult with the College of Dual Credit Office for details.
