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2025 FISCAL YEAR SUMMARY

Classes provided from FY24 to FY25 increased from 397 to 433, and the number of schools providing driver education dropped from 80 in FY24 to 72 in FY25. The increase in classes offered is likely due to urban areas offering additional courses to accommodate the population growth. The drop in schools providing driver education is most certainly due to the Parent-Student On-Road Driver Training (PSORDT) program allowed in rural areas, leading many schools to cancel their driver education programs. PSORDT has increased with the addition of other options for online driver education. With fewer programs, reimbursements for FY25 totaled \$1,019,496.22, down from \$1,195,133.30 for FY24.

Several Local Education Agencies (LEAs) have considered cancelling their driver education programs because of the financial burden. LEAs are currently reimbursed \$150 per student taught, but the costs of classroom hours, behind-the-wheel hours, and observation hours often far exceed the reimbursement. In FY25, driver education programs cost the school districts \$354,375.15 of their operations budgets, which was approximately 12% of the total cost of the driver education program. The remaining 88% was paid for with fees collected from students, Advanced Opportunities funds, and State reimbursement to the LEAs. (See Appendix I for chart of Driver Education Program Costs.)

Annual Statutory Requirements

Idaho Code §33-1707 states in part: Annually, no later than the first day of September in each year, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall cause the supervisor of driver training to prepare a report listing the names of the school districts and the amounts of money paid as required in Idaho Code §33-1706.

33-1707. Reimbursement – Determination

Certification. a. From the data provided by the school district, as required by section Idaho Code §33-1706, the state department of education shall compute the average of the number of pupils enrolling in the course and those completing the same, and determine for such average number, the per-pupil cost thereof. The amount due to the district from the driver training fund in the state treasury shall be the total cost of operating the program, or the average of the number enrolling in the course and those completing the same, multiplied by one hundred fifty dollars (\$150), whichever is the lesser.
