4.6.1 Within two weeks following any incident involving a public driver training vehicle, the school district must submit a current SDE Collision/ Incident Report Form to the Idaho State Department of Education. 4.6.2 All driver training vehicles involved in a collision will be required to file a report with the appropriate police agency. The school district will provide a copy of the police report to the Idaho State Department of Education. Codes from the Idaho Public Driver Education Program Manual. There have been several collisions involving Driver Education vehicles this summer. Thankfully, no students or instructors were injured. It is *strongly recommended* that your in-car binder include a <u>Collision/</u> Incident Report. For some collisions, I will also need a vehicle inspection report completed. Please contact me with questions. Be safe and always expect the unexpected.

#### **Reminder!**

Make sure that the completion date on the student sheet submitted to the DMV and SDE is the <u>same date</u> the student receives his/her permit <u>and</u> is the <u>same date</u> listed on his/her certificate.

Small discrepancies can lead to the student testing too soon which makes the test invalid, cost the student/parent more money, and makes people *very upset*. The DMV agent ends up taking the brunt of that frustration and it is not fair to them. Please double check your dates!
