

Greetings,

I want to start off by saying "Well Done Everyone!" I know that this has probably been the hardest school year you've experienced in your career. I appreciate all the extra work you have put in to keep educating our new drivers and in turn helping to keep our roadways safe.

As the state's case rates increase again, many DMV and sheriff's offices are either closed or not accepting out-of-county appointments. This is making it harder for students to obtain their permits prior to driver education classes starting. We are still waiving the requirement to have a permit before any instruction begins. However, **ABSOLUTELY NO** behind-the-wheel instruction can take place without a permit.

Recently I have received a few calls from instructors about students caught driving outside of class hours without their permit. Whether they receive a ticket or not, this is a violation of the operating policies and procedures of the <a href="Program Manual">Program Manual</a>. It is a good idea to have all students and parent/guardians sign that they acknowledge these policies. If you don't already have something for signatures, I have uploaded an example on the website or <a href="click here">click here</a>.

Another thing I would like to clarify for our newer instructors is when students fail driver education classes. It doesn't matter the age of the student, the permit is sent back to the DMV office with a note stating the student failed. There is a misconception about if the student is already 17 or older. They aren't required take Driver Education, therefore, they can have their permit even if they fail—FALSE! The student has not yet taken the knowledge test which is required if they want to obtain an Instructional Permit at 17 years old and not take Driver Education.


