LITERACY - FY 2024 DISTRIBUTION – IDAHO CODE 33-1806, 1807

\$72,812,000 has been appropriated for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 to support reading instruction and intervention, reading assessment, and literacy intervention.

For the FY 2024, school districts and public charter schools shall receive a per student amount of \$378, calculated on the number of 2022-2023 enrolled students in kindergarten through grade 3 (as of the first Friday in November); and shall receive \$415 per student who improved a full tier or who remained proficient on the statewide reading assessment, Spring 2022 to Spring 2023. If there is not a prior spring assessment for a student, use the Fall 2022 to Spring 2023 statewide reading assessment. Economically disadvantaged students who improve a full tier or remain proficient will receive an additional .75 weighting.

LITERACY INTERVENTION PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Each school district and public charter school shall establish an extended time literacy intervention program for students who score basic or below basic on the fall reading screening assessments or alternate reading screening assessment in kindergarten through grade 3 and submit it to the state board of education.

The program must provide a proven effective evidence-based substantial intervention and shall include phonemic awareness, decoding intervention, vocabulary, comprehension, and fluency as applicable to the student based on a formative assessment designed to, at a minimum, identify such weaknesses. A minimum of sixty (60) hours of supplemental instruction for students in kindergarten through grade 3 who score below basic on the reading screening assessment, and a minimum of thirty (30) hours of supplemental instruction for students in kindergarten through grade 3 who score basic on the reading screening assessment.

The program shall also monitor the reading progress of each student's reading skills throughout the school year and adjust instruction according to student needs. Monitoring may include both local and statewide assessments.

ACCEPTABLE USE OF LITERACY INTERVENTION FUNDS

Schools can use literacy intervention funds to cover any expenditure which supports the extended time literacy intervention program. This includes but may not be limited to;

- Salaries
- Curricular materials
- Instructional resources/materials
- Professional development
- Online or Digital instructional materials or programs
- Technology devices (e.g. laptops, iPads, other)
- Library resources
- Up to but not more than one hundred dollars (\$100) per student may be used for transportation

Of note, funds expended on personnel were generally unchanged and continue to be the category where the majority of funds are utilized. No categories saw significant changes from FY23. Overall, spending patterns varied greatly from district to district, including some districts spending funds in all categories and others expending all funds in a single category.

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
